









Entering my second year as president, I wish to assure you that our Endowment Board is committed to continuing the mission of working collaboratively with our Temple leadership to support and sustain our congregation — and that we remain vested in ensuring a strong Temple Emanu-El in perpetuity.

I believe that you are all familiar with the story from the Talmud of planting the caleb trees, as well as Doug Colter's song, "Standing on the Shoulders". *See lyrics on the adjacent page of this Annual Report*. Both illustrate one of the greatest principles in life: the concept of sowing seeds. They teach us that if we plant something and nurture it, we can reap something greater in the future. This teaching applies to us here at Temple Emanu-El... we have the power to build our endowment to ensure the financial security for generations to come.

Our congregation is certainly stronger today because of the foresight and generosity of so many people who contributed to our endowment over the past 40+ years. We are seeing the rewards of their generosity, and it is up to us to ensure that the next generation continues to see the great rewards that a strong endowment can provide for our temple.

To that end, we are extremely pleased that this past year our Endowment Fund was able to increase our grants to the Temple by over \$100,000. This is partially due to recent gifts, as well as the increase of programming opportunities as Covid restrictions have lifted. Providing allocations of over \$580,000 last year has enabled our congregation to enjoy so many programs and enhancements — such as the magnificent High Holy Day Choir and other musical programs, upgrades in our technology and capital improvements, and a multitude of Religious School enhancements, as well as underwriting a healthy portion of our clergy and staff positions. *Details of this past year's funding enrichments are highlighted on pages 3-4*.

I would be remiss if I didn't recognize Jann Blitz, our Endowment Fund's executive director over the past 26 years. Jann is retiring from her position at the end of October, and her contributions to our efforts over these years is unparalleled. She has helped our Endowment Fund to grow and prosper, run efficiently, and supported the efforts of every Endowment officer to allow this organization to flourish. The Grafman Endowment Fund will forever be grateful for her hard work and dedication. We are very excited to have Alison Berman join our team, succeeding Jann in the executive director position.

And to our congregation, on behalf of our Temple and Endowment leadership, we thank you! And we encourage you to continue to support our Endowment Fund to enrich our congregation today, as well as to ensure that a positive future is possible for generations to come. *In doing so, we can each help plant the seeds upon which our congregation can grow.*

### **Our Funds at Work**

This past year our Endowment Fund provided funding benefitting our congregational family of over \$580,000 - an increase of over \$100,000 from last year. This allocation supplemented our clergy salaries, significantly supported our technology, communications and facility improvements, and provided many of the enrichments and programming which were more plentiful with Covid restrictions being lifted. Following are highlights of how these funds impacted our congregation during this past year:





#### SUPPORTING OUR CLERGY TEAM \$111,050

- A meaningful contribution to help support our clergy to serve our congregation, including the senior rabbinic and cantorial positions (*Rabbi Jonathan Miller Enduring Legacy Fund* and the *Ruth & Marvin Engel Cantorial Fund*).
- · Partial funding of the Rabbi Emeritus retirement package (Miller Retirement Fund).

#### ENRICHING OUR PROGRAMMING \$265,180

#### **ENHANCING WORSHIP & RITUAL**

- The purchase of a number of new prayerbooks, Mishkan T'filah, for our congregation's Shabbat worship (Reese Family Fund and Margaret & Maurice Salloway Legacy Fund).
- High Holy Day enhancements this past year included the magnificent choir, the beautiful flowers adorning the bima and Break-the-Fast take-away bags (Ruth & Marvin Engel Cantorial & High Holy Day Choir Fund, Andrew Abroms Memorial Flower Fund, and Sherron & Allan Goldstein Break-the-Fast Fund).
- · Occasional performances by the new bima band, "The Graftones" and a newly formed quartette both musically enhancing our worship services throughout the Spring (Ruth & J.D. Rosenberger Music Fund and Barrye & Jay Ziff Cultural Arts Fund).
- Several milestone events including Cantor Wittner's installation, the lovely luncheon following the baby naming of Rachel & Rabbi Wright's twins and the Annual Congregational Meeting honoring our volunteers (Ruth & Marvin Engel Music Fund, Sherron & Allan Goldstein Fund, Hannah & Hyman Goldstein Volunteer Fund and Muncy Harris Abroms Cultural Arts Fund).
- Underwriting a portion of the Music Director's salary, as well as the wonderful evening to honor Paul Mosteller's 30-year tenure as our organist and choir director (*Joan & Milton Jacobson Cultural Arts Fund*).
- A number of holiday programs including special treats for Hanukkah and the young adult Purim celebration, as well as our traditional congregational Purim Spiel and Passover Seder (Ellen & Jack Aland Membership Engagement Fund, Muncy Harris Abroms Cultural Arts Fund and Faye & Norris Friedman Social Enrichment Fund).

#### CARING FOR OUR CONGREGANTS AND GREATER COMMUNITY

- Welcome packages delivered to each of our new members and holiday bags distributed to our older or infirmed congregants throughout the year (Ellen & Jack Aland Membership Engagement Fund and Leona & Marvin Cherner Caring Community Fund).
- · Leadership training for our Temple and Endowment Boards (Nina & Norman Cohen Next Generation Fund).
- Sponsorship of our Tikkun Olam Committee's annual Mitzvah Day, involving a morning of work on several social action endeavors, as well as projects to support our own Hineynu / Caring Committee (Hermione & Edward Friend Community Fund).
- Community Israel program and dinner with a documentary featuring former Israeli Prime Minister Begin (Steiner Interfaith Fund).
- Support of the Hillel Connections initiative providing housing, programming, and connecting area university student interns to our Birmingham Jewish community (Nina & Norman Cohen Next Generation Fund).

## IMPACT OF YOUR SUPPORT

• Financial assistance scholarships and a recognition award further enabled six (6) teens to participate in Jewish summer camps (Barbara Abrams & Julian Aland Scholarship Funds, Betty Allenberg Goldstein Camp Jacobs Scholarship Fund, Diana & Sidney Patterson Scholarship Fund and Lester Siegel Scholarship Fund).

#### ADVANCING OUR TECHNOLOGIES & COMMUNICATIONS

- The annual fees for the live-stream webcast of Shabbat and holiday worship services ("Our Temple" Worship Anywhere Fund).
- The purchase of a new video conferencing cart to facilitate our virtual learning and meeting experiences (*Odess Technology Fund*).
- Annual website and Zoom fees, plus the production of eleven issues of the monthly bulletin and the weekly announcement programs distributed at Shabbat and holiday services to help keep our congregation informed and connected.

#### UNRESTRICTED OPERATIONAL SUPPORT

· Another \$93,900 for unrestricted purposes was also provided.



"We created the **Erin Rosemore Fund** in 2018 to honor our eldest daughter, Erin, of blessed memory. She loved Temple Emanu-El and relished her time spent in religious school. She always took great pride in every task; and while she was intellectually challenged with Down's syndrome, she had the ability to accomplish many of the educational goals as her peers.

We initially created this fund as an unrestricted endowed fund, with a long-term goal of substantially growing it to a point where we could designate it as a fund to provide the extra resources any Temple youth might need to achieve their independent goals in conjunction with religious school. This might be to help underwrite outside tutors, teacher assistants, or perhaps facilitate a non-Hebrew tract to keep these kids engaged without pursuing the bar or bat mitzvah tract. Ideally, we would just like to provide these special needs children who would love to be connected with the means for greater inclusion."

Michael joined the Temple in 1986 when he arrived in Birmingham for his medical residency – wanting to connect with the Jewish community here. He was delighted to become active in some of

the social programs and expand both his friendships, as well as his medical colleague base. Michael added, "This congregation has always felt like a second home to me – from marriage to raising our children. And, I know that Erin felt the same – she would have continued her education through adulthood because she loved the Temple that much".

### **Benefactors & Annual Gifts**

It is our pleasure to once again recognize those members who generously gave to our Endowment Fund over and above their other Temple obligations. This year, we are pleased to report **contributions totaling over \$426,000**. In addition to the final gifts from donors fulfilling multi-year pleades **honoring Rabbi Jonathan Miller** totaling nearly \$55,000, we also received over \$67,000 in gifts from over 165 donors to **honor Paul Mosteller's** retirement in December.

In addition and highlighted in the Benefactor Highlights below, we received numerous gifts to **create or further build Endowed Named Funds**, as well as a number of **bequests** from long-standing congregants during the past fiscal year totaling close to \$125,000. We also credit our unique **Annual Endowment Gifts Program** for its contribution to this growth, as we received over \$105,000 in Annual Gifts contributed voluntarily by 284 members, representing participation by almost half of our congregation. Collectively with gifts over the past 20+ years, this Annual Program now provides grants to the Temple of over \$54,000 per year – it just goes to show that contributions of all sizes over time can make an incredible difference.

Please remember that we are most appreciative of contributions of **any amount** — as each gift enables **everyone** to take part in enriching our congregation today as well as in planting the seeds to ensure a vibrant future for our spiritual home.

Donors make no restrictions on how these funds are to be used to enrich our congregation, leaving those decisions to the Endowment Fund Board of Directors.





## Financial Highlights (July 1, 2021 - June 30, 2022) Over the past 40+ years, the value of our Endowment Fund has continued to

benefit from the on-going generosity of our congregants who understand the importance of a permanent endowment. This past year, we benefitted from:

- gifts from over half of our congregation to our Annual Endowment Gift program;
- bequests and other deferred gifts planned by nearly 90 members of our congregation;
- and 170 grant-making funds ranging in size from \$5,000 to \$2.6 million; created by generous and forward-thinking members to support our temple, forever.

Contributions this year were over \$426,000, reflecting in part the substantial gifts and creation of a number of new named funds, as well as several thoughtful bequests. Investment Returns for 2022 fiscal year-end (June 30) was -14.14 percent, following an exceptional 2021 fiscal year of nearly 30 percent. Because of the composition of our portfolio, we do expect and accept volatility in our returns with the expectation that over the long term our results will meet our investment return goals. Our spending policy produces allocations that insulates the Temple from this volatility.

Allocations to enrich our congregational family continued to make substantial impact, totaling over \$580,000 to enhance our Temple's programing and operations and provide for a variety of youth scholarships for Jewish experiences. This represents a significant increase of more than \$100,000 allocated over the prior few years.

#### **OUR SPENDING & INVESTMENT POLICIES**

The Endowment Fund Board of Directors utilize spending and investment policies that attempt to provide a predictable stream of funding to programs for Temple Emanu-El, while seeking to maintain the purchasing power of our Endowment assets.

**SPENDING POLICY** To determine the level of allocations for our General and Unrestricted Funds, we utilize the spend rate formula developed by Yale University for its endowment, which is seen to have a smoothing effect regarding spending from year to year. This formula takes into account last year's account balances, inflation and historical spend rates. The derived spend rate generally varies between 4 and 6 percent depending on market conditions, and includes both allocations and the Endowment Fund's annual operational expenses. The spend rate for the past year (2021-22) was 4.21 percent.

In making allocations, the Restricted Funds use a spend rate determined each year by the Board of Directors. Spending is calculated annually and generally is the lessor of the percentage derived from the above-mentioned Yale Policy or 5 percent of the fund balance as of December 31 of the prior year. This past year the spend rate for these funds was 3.36 percent of the fund balance, plus .85 percent for operating expenses. For many of the Restricted Funds, however, if the balance is below its accumulated principal, spending is limited by the board at the request of the donor until the fund balance rises above the principal balance.

**INVESTMENT POLICY** The above spending policy is a major factor in determining the investment policy. The Grafman Endowment Fund Board retains the Custom Investment Outsourcing (CIO) division of Morgan Stanley to oversee its investments, which includes full discretion for investing our portfolio and making day-to-day decisions under the guidelines of the board approved investment policy. The Endowment Board's Investment Committee receives timely reports and meets biannually with our Morgan Stanley advisors in order to monitor our results.

Under the investment policy, endowment assets are invested in a manner that should produce an annualized return of around 7 percent over the long-term. Actual returns in any given year may vary from this amount, and are measured against a blended benchmark that closely matches our Endowment investments. Investment returns in excess of the allocations provided to the Temple are reinvested and should increase the assets and preserve the spending power of the Endowment Fund.

STRATEGIES EMPLOYED FOR ACHIEVING OBJECTIVES To satisfy our long-term objectives, the Board relies on a "total return" strategy in which investment returns are achieved through both capital appreciation (realized and unrealized) and yield (interest and dividends). We employ a diversified asset allocation utilizing equity-based investments, fixed income, alternative investments and cash to achieve our long-term objectives.



Standing for the Jewish people for over 30 years ~ This past fall culminated with a celebration of the retirement of our music director, Paul Mosteller, for his steadfast leadership of our Temple's powerful and spiritual musical accompaniment. Affectionately known as our "maestro of music", Paul consistently delivered the high quality of music and choral direction that our congregation has enjoyed and come to expect for decades. He was a part of so many of our celebrations, weddings, baby namings and bar/bat mitzvahs, as well as delivered the music that comforted so many mourners. He is a great singer himself and understands the nuances that singers experience, plus his acumen for Jewish music is simply outstanding. He was with us every Friday night and Saturday morning – always standing for the Jewish people.

Our Grafman Endowment Fund was instrumental in underwriting a spectacular musical evening as a tribute to Paul's fantastic 30-year tenure. We also orchestrated a fundraising effort generating over 160 gifts from across the community totaling over \$67,000 to honor his legacy. With the creation of a new endowed fund, the Paul Mosteller Director of Music Fund, which will support the Director of Music position and provide for musical operations, we are thrilled that Paul will forever be linked to our congregation in perpetuity.





## How You Can Give You can become a part of the growing number of congregants who have made a commitment to the future financial stability of our Temple. Following are some of the options — both large and small — available to contribute through the Endowment Fund. Many result in significant estate and/or income tax savings.



WHAT IS AN ENDOWMENT FUND?

An endowment is a fund that is made up of gifts and bequests made to a non-profit group or institution that are subject to a requirement that the principal is maintained intact in perpetuity — and invested to provide a permanent source of income for the organization that they support.

**CASH & SECURITIES** This is probably the easiest and most popular method of charitable giving. You might consider giving a contribution to honor or remember a loved one, or making an Annual Endowment Gift over and above your dues. Or with a minimum contribution of \$5,000, a Named Fund can be established in the name of your family or a family member. Following are suggested contribution levels for many of the giving opportunities provided by the Endowment Fund:

AS DESCRIBED ON PAGE 10: General Contributions: \$10 per name, minimum \$10 per name, minimum

Memorial Plaques: \$500 per plaque

AS DESCRIBED ON PAGE 5-6: Annual Gifts: \$25 minimum \$100+ receive special benefits

AS DESCRIBED ON PAGE 7-8: Named Funds: \$5,000 min. for an unrestricted fund \$25,000 min. for a restricted fund

**BEQUESTS IN A WILL** Such bequests will provide estate tax charitable deductions by naming Temple Emanu-El as primary or contingent beneficiary, in the event that your primary beneficiary is not living. This is typically done in the form of a bequest of a certain amount or a fraction of your estate.

**RETIREMENT PLANS** Designating a charitable organization, such as the Temple, as beneficiary of your retirement plan is often a very tax-efficient way to make a gift because such plans are subject to both income and estate taxes.

**CHARITABLE TRUSTS & ANNUITIES** You may make a gift to the Endowment Fund through a charitable trust or in the form of an annuity. Either arrangement may provide benefits for yourself and/or your family for the remainder of your life or for a term of years; at your death or at the end of the term, the remainder is paid to the Endowment Fund. These arrangements provide immediate income tax benefits to you and ensure a flow of income for your living needs.

**LIFE INSURANCE POLICIES** You can purchase a life insurance policy naming the Temple as the owner/beneficiary. Annual premiums would be deductible for income tax purposes. Another method is to transfer to the Temple any older, existing insurance contracts that you might have. This type of gift could also result in some significant income tax deductions.

**REAL ESTATE OR OTHER PROPERTY** There are opportunities for making gifts of works of art, jewelry, antiques or real estate. In this case, the fair market value is deductible, regardless of cost.

**ISRAEL BONDS** You may also purchase an Israel bond and gift it to the Endowment Fund – which not only benefits the State of Israel and our Temple, but allows you to be eligible to receive tax benefits as well.



**Together, we have made a great impact** ~ Our Temple's Grafman Endowment Fund was born through the vision of Charles Collat, Sr. to create a foundation like many great universities to provide both for today and for tomorrow's generations. I had the honor some 26 years ago of being selected to serve as this Endowment's first executive director. Now, as I embark on my retirement, I have the opportunity to reflect back on the time spent serving this wonderful congregation and to consider how far we have come.

I have been fortunate to serve with the most dedicated and talented leadership in fulfilling our mission and creating a culture of excellence. The spirit of "daring to grow and make an impact" has become inherent in our Endowment board members — I've witnessed it in the conference rooms, in letters and phone calls, and in one-on-one conversations with friends and donors. I've had the great privilege to get to know and work with the most caring congregants in designating gifts to support this Temple, and in telling their stories to inspire others. And, I've had the unique opportunity to use my organizational, stewardship and marketing background to help this Endowment grow and prosper — and indeed make a tremendous impact on our beloved congregation. To that end, today our Grafman Endowment Fund is a role model for other congregations across the country. And for all this, and to all of you, I am most grateful...Now and Forever.


