If not us, then who?


It not now, when?

Our Funds at Work

For the 2023-24 fiscal year, our Endowment Fund supported Temple Emanu-El with more than \$870,000 in allocations. This extraordinary level of funding was made possible through the generosity of our congregational family — past and present — along with sound investment oversight, and a special 5-year grant created through our Endowment and Temple Leadership working together.

UNRESTRICTED NAMED FUNDS SUPPORT — \$529,594

Unrestricted Named Funds, used where needed most at temple, are critical for helping to bolster operational expenses, such as security, communications, technology, building upkeep, personnel, programming, and much more. Unrestricted funds are the most popular, flexible, and effective way to perpetually support temple, which receives 100% of the available allocations from these funds each year. Thank you to the more than 100 families who helped make a remarkable grant to temple during 2023-24 through these funds.

RESTRICTED NAMED FUNDS SUPPORT — \$340,771

Restricted Named Funds offer support to temple in ways that are personally meaningful to donors. These 70 funds provide funding opportunities for a wide variety of areas throughout the year when aligned with a specific temple program or need. The broader the fund's defined purpose, the more likely the entire allocation can be tapped each year.



ENDOWED DUES — \$88,555

Our endowment and temple are incredibly fortunate to have nineteen (19) families who have endowed their temple dues. Though considered a "restricted" named fund, temple uses these allocations where needed most. Once an Endowed Dues Fund is created, all or a portion of your annual commitment to temple is endowed in perpetuity, which is a benefit to both the donor(s) and temple.

Our Endowment Fund consists of Restricted and Unrestricted Named Funds, as listed on pages 8-9. Unrestricted Named Funds allow for available funds to be used where needed most at temple. Restricted Funds fall under six categories and lend support to Our Temple by "matching" a temple need with a Fund's purpose, as defined by the donor.

Five Generations at Our Temple

In April, Alison Berman had the opportunity to visit with Morton Goldfarb. What a treat to learn about his colorful life, see incredible sports cars, hear about his passion for training German Shepherds, and become educated on the family's rich history with Temple Emanu-El. What was most palpable was his love for Janet, of blessed memory, and their 62 years of marriage.

The family's connection with Temple Emanu-El began in 1884 when Janet's great-grandfather, Samuel Ullman, moved to Birmingham and later became the first lay rabbi at temple. Samuel's daughter, Leah, married Rabbi Morris Newfield, Temple's first official rabbi.

The Ullman-Newfield-Minisman-Goldfarb extended family ties run deep in our greater community and within our spiritual home. As of Spring 2025, five generations including Janet & Morton will have married at Temple Emanu-El. Officiants for these unions include Samual Ullman, Rabbi Newfield, Rabbi Grafman, and Rabbi Miller. The next honor will belong to Rabbi Wright.

As Morton and Alison talked about family and temple engagement, he shared that he is not a regular attendee at temple, yet he feels a strong Jewish connection. "Being Jewish is a way of life," shared Morton and his guiding light comes from:

If you can't pray in the temple; pray in the field. If you can't pray in the field, pray in the house.

Morton spoke also of his desire to help maintain Jewish identity in our community and to **safeguard the future of Our Temple through a bequest: the ultimate gift.** Thank you, Morton. L'dor V'dor.

YOUTH by Samuel Ullman

Samuel Ullman's compassion, activism, religious passion, and philanthropy are well-known in our community and beyond. His life and legacy are memorialized in the Samuel Ullman Museum located in Birmingham's Southside. He remains beloved worldwide for his famous poem, "Youth," shared below. Though penned around 1920, his sentiments endure today.

Youth is not a time of life; it is a state of mind; it is not a matter of rosy cheeks, red lips, and supple knees; it is a matter of the will; a quality of the imagination, a vigor the emotions; it is the freshness of the deep spring of life.

Youth means a temperamental predominance of courage over timidity of the appetite, for adventure over the love of ease. This often exists in a man of sixty more than a boy of twenty. Nobody grows old merely by a number of years. We grow old by deserting our ideals.

Years may wrinkle the skin, but to give up enthusiasm wrinkles the soul. Worry, fear, self-distrust bows the heart and turns the spirit back to dust.

Whether sixty or sixteen, there is in every human being's heart the lure of wonder, the unfailing child-like appetite of what's next, and the joy of the game of living. In the center of your heart and my heart there is a wireless station; so long as it receives messages of beauty, hope, cheer, courage and power from men and from the Infinite, so long as you are young.

When the aerials are down, and your spirit is covered with the snows of cynicism and the ice of pessimism, then you are grown old, even at twenty, but as long as your aerials are up, to catch the waves of optimism, there is hope you may die young at eighty.

Financial Highlights (July 1, 2023 – June 30, 2024)

Over the past 45 years our Grafman Endowment Fund has grown through the ongoing generosity of congregants who want to help ensure temple's vibrancy — today and for the future. This past year, our temple and congregation benefitted from:

- Gifts from over 200 of our congregant families to our Annual Endowment Gift Campaign
- Bequests and other deferred gifts planned by over 125 congregants
- Allocations from 176 Named Funds, created by generous and forward-thinking members wishing to support our Temple ... now and forever

Contributions this year were over \$760,000, reflecting all gifts including the creation of new named funds and thoughtful bequests.

Investment Returns for our 2023-24 fiscal year (July 1 - June 30) were 14.41 percent, with investment income of \$3,051,244. Because of the composition of our portfolio, we do expect and accept volatility in our returns with the expectation that over the long term our results will meet our investment return goals. Our spending policy produces allocations that insulate the temple from volatility.

Allocations to enrich our congregational family continued to have transformational impact. Allocations to temple from unrestricted and restricted named funds totaled more than \$871,000. These funds enhance temple's programming and operations and provide youth scholarships to encourage Jewish experiences. Included in the total allocation to temple are funds from the special five-year grant agreement between our endowment and temple which ends by June 30, 2027.

OUR SPENDING & INVESTMENT POLICIES

The Endowment Fund Board of Directors follow spending and investment policies that strive to provide a **predictable stream of funding for Temple Emanu-El**, while seeking to maintain the purchasing power of endowment assets.

SPENDING POLICY

To determine the level of allocations made to temple from our General and Unrestricted Funds, the endowment board of directors follows the spend rate formula developed by Yale University for its endowment, which has proven to have a smoothing effect regarding spending from year to year. This formula considers last year's account balances, inflation, and historical spend rates. The derived spend rate varies between 4 and 6 percent depending on market conditions and includes both allocations and annual endowment operational expenses. The spend rate for the past year (2023-24) was 4.76 percent.

In making allocations, Restricted Funds use a spend rate determined each year by the Board of Directors. Spending is calculated annually and generally is the lessor of the percentage derived from the above-mentioned Yale Policy or 5 percent of the fund balance as of December 31 of the prior year. This past year the spend rate for these funds was 3.91 percent of the fund balance, plus .85 percent for operating expenses.

INVESTMENT POLICY

The above spending policy is a major factor in determining the investment policy. The Grafman Endowment Fund Board retains the Custom Investment Outsourcing (CIO) division of Morgan Stanley to oversee its investments, which includes full discretion for investing our portfolio and making day-to-day decisions under the guidelines of the board approved investment policy. The Endowment Board's Investment Committee receives timely reports and meets biannually with our Morgan Stanley advisors to strategize and review performance.

Under the investment policy, endowment assets are invested in a manner that should produce an annualized return of around 7 percent over the long term. Actual returns in any given year may vary from this amount and are measured against a blended benchmark that closely matches our Endowment investments. Investment returns in excess of the allocations provided to the Temple are reinvested to further build the assets and preserve the spending power of the Endowment Fund.

STRATEGIES EMPLOYED FOR ACHIEVING OBJECTIVES

To satisfy our long-term objectives, the Board relies on a "total return" strategy in which investment returns are achieved through both capital appreciation (realized and unrealized) and yield (interest and dividends). The Grafman Endowment Fund employs a diversified asset allocation utilizing equity-based investments, fixed income, alternative investments, and cash to achieve our long-term objectives.



How YOU CAN Support Temple

Our Endowment Board of Directors invites you to join the growing number of congregants who have made a **commitment to the future financial stability of Our Temple.** Following are some of the options — representing gifts of all sizes – to encourage your participation in the endowment fund. Many of these charitable vehicles can result in significant **estate and/or income tax savings**.

CASH & SECURITIES This is typically the easiest and most popular method of charitable giving. You might consider giving a contribution to honor or remember a loved one, or making an Annual Endowment Gift over and above your dues. Or with a minimum contribution of \$5,000, a Named Fund can be established in the name of your family or a family member.

Following are suggested contribution levels for many of the giving opportunities provided by the Endowment Fund:

General Contributions: \$18 suggested minimum • Memorial Book: \$10 per name, minimum • Memorial Plaques: \$500 per plaque
Annual Gifts: \$36 suggested minimum; \$100+ receive complimentary tributes

Named Funds: \$5,000 minimum for an unrestricted fund; \$25,000 minimum for a restricted fund

BEQUESTS IN A WILL Such bequests will provide estate tax charitable deductions by naming Temple Emanu-El as primary or contingent beneficiary, in the event that your primary beneficiary is not living. This is typically done in the form of a bequest of a certain amount or a fraction of your estate.

RETIREMENT PLANS Designating a charitable organization, such as the Temple, as beneficiary of your retirement plan is often a very tax-efficient way to make a gift because such plans are subject to both income and estate taxes.

CHARITABLE TRUSTS & ANNUITIES You may make a gift to the Endowment Fund through a charitable trust or in the form of an annuity. Either arrangement may provide benefits for yourself and/or your family for the remainder of your life or for a term of years; at your death or at the end of the term, the remainder is paid to the Endowment Fund. These arrangements provide immediate income tax benefits to you and ensure a flow of income for your living needs.

LIFE INSURANCE POLICIES You can purchase a life insurance policy naming the Temple as the owner/beneficiary. Annual premiums would be deductible for income tax purposes. Another method is to transfer to the Temple any older, existing insurance contracts that you might have. This type of gift could also result in some significant income tax deductions.

REAL ESTATE OR OTHER PROPERTY There are opportunities for making gifts of works of art, jewelry, antiques or real estate. In this case, the fair market value is deductible, regardless of cost.

ISRAEL BONDS You may also purchase an Israel Bond and gift it to the Endowment Fund - which not only benefits the State of Israel and Our Temple, but allows you to be eligible to receive tax benefits as well.

What is an Endowment Fund?

An endowment fund is a fund that consists of gifts and bequests made to a non-profit group or institution and are subject to a requirement that the principal is maintained intact in perpetuity – and invested to provide a permanent source of income for the organization that they support.

Let's Band Together



As I reflect on the past fiscal year, my thoughts instantly revert to October 6, 2023. (Yes, October 6.) I attended temple's beautiful Simchat Torah family service and enjoyed a festive evening with fellow congregants and their families. I left with a full heart.

Hours later, disbelief would consume me as I watched the unfolding gut-wrenching news of the unspeakable attack on Israel. My full heart shattered. I imagine that you can relate.

Our community banded together and jumped into action, as we so often do. A renewed yet intrinsically deeper feeling about Judaism, temple, and the role of our Endowment Fund embraced me. Safeguarding a strong, vibrant Jewish — and Reform — identity in our greater community became of supreme importance. I was not alone.

Temple Emanu-El began 142 years ago. We are privileged to have families that have been members across generations and to have welcomed new families along the way. While we live

for today, we must plan for the future just as those who came before us have done. Our endowment – YOUR ENDOWMENT – makes this possible.
